Brushy Creek Baptist Church was among the first of organized churches in Greenville County and from it's inception kept records of the meetings and members.

This 1834 member roll lists local residents, many being some of the first settlers of the area and their descendants.

Consider, too, that for many years this was the only church to hold regular meetings and drew members from communities a considerable distant away. Brushy Creek was the "Mother" church for many that sprang up in nearby communities. This member roll reflects a time shortly after some of the members branched out to form Mountain Creek Baptist Church and Pleasant Grove Baptist Church.
